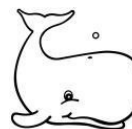

BLUE WHALE

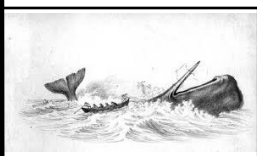


The blue whale is the largest animal to have ever lived. The blue whale may weigh up to 200000kg or 200 tonnes. The blue _____ may be the equal in size of 3 large dinosaurs or 30 elephants.

In length, the whale is 30 metres _____ and in width, 15 metres at the girth. The tail flukes (tail wings) are 6.5 meters wide.



Blue whales are found in all the world's oceans except the Arctic and enclosed seas but their numbers have been seriously reduced. Once blue whales numbered over 300000 on earth and were abundant in all the _____. Blue whales were hunted extensively by whalers over the last three centuries and by the 20th Century the blue whale had almost _____ exterminated.



Historically, blue whales were somewhat protected by the perilous nature of whale hunting. However, despite the dangers and seamen spending many years at sea, by the late 18th and 19th _____ whaling adventures had increased significantly.

Moby Dick tells the story of this legendary trade. Financial gain and adventure encouraged the trade and whale numbers began to seriously decline. By the 19th and 20th Centuries, blue whale numbers were _____ rapidly, mostly due to industrial developments. Factory ships, steam and oil powered

ships and the explosive harpoon all enabled more proficient and larger scale killing and slaughtering of whales. The rapid decline in whale numbers continued throughout the 19th Century and well into the 20th Century. In one year alone, 1931, 30000 blue whales were



_____. Estimates maintain that 300000 blue whales were killed in the Antarctic region alone in the 20th Century. At the end of the 20th century there were less than 5000 blue whales on _____.

World-wide public protest led to the cessation of most blue whale killing. The international community drew up a treaty in 1966. The blue whale is now a protected _____. The blue whale retains a global distribution and can still be found in all the world's oceans except the Arctic, albeit with some difficulty. Despite this world wide distribution, blue whales remain one of the rarest of the whales, numbering between 10,000 - 25,000.
